

From military facility to cultural centre

The Fortress of Bard is an imposing military structure built in the first half of the 19th century atop a rocky prominence at the entrance to the Aosta Valley. Thanks to extensive renovation work, the fortress has been a cultural and tourist centre since 2006, hosting museums, international exhibitions, events, and state-of-the-art information and reception services. A visit to the Fort allows you to admire its impressive military architecture. The structure consists of three

main buildings, located at different levels between 400 and 467 metres above sea level, totalling 14,467 square metres: from the lowest, the *Opera Ferdinando*, through the middle, the *Opera Vittorio*, to the highest, the *Opera Carlo Alberto*. In all, 283 rooms, capable of accommodating a garrison of a thousand men. Fifty or so guns, 296 loopholes. There are two squares at the apex of the fortress, covering an area of 2,036 square metres, where events and happenings are held.

THE MUSEUM OF THE ALPS

The Museum of the Alps is a multi-disciplinary, interactive and multimedia space dedicated to the Alps and mountains in general. The rooms use a combination of tradition and new technology to tell the story of a living, breathing mountain transformed in the hands of mankind.





In three sections, the museum offers an exciting journey through the evolution of defensive techniques, siege systems along the Alpine arc and the concept of the frontier.



THE PRISONS

The history of Fort Bard is revealed through films, documents and 3D reconstructions. Visitors learn about the architectural evolution of the fortress, and the figures who have played a significant role in its history. From the year 1000 to its reconstruction in 1830 and up to the present day.





THE CHILDREN'S

The Children's Alps Museum will reopen to the public in autumn 2025 with a completely new look, exploring themes related to environmental awareness. With a particular focus on the mountains and glaciers of the Aosta Valley, the visit to the rooms is structured to provide an immersive and interactive experience.

EXHIBITIONS

Throughout the year, Fort Bard hosts a rich and varied range of temporary exhibitions in several areas: the Cannoniere (Gunports), the Cantine (Cellars), the Scuderie (Stables) and the Opera Mortai. The exhibitions range from art to photography, from comics to scientific research focusing on climate change.
